The presentation itself only takes about 15 minutes, and the sorting game that follows lasts for about 15-20 minutes. Overall, the collective presentation should not be more than 35 minutes. The event is open to anyone in the residence hall community, and we are hoping to host about 60 participants.

The 2011-2012 RHA provided funds for a pilot launch of this education program. Evaluations we completed after each hall presentation/activity and the overwhelming response was very positive. Attendees enjoyed the information and the activity. The Campus Zero Waste Program noted better recycling habits in the halls that hosted this educational event.

Project Description: The Bean Movie nights are held every week on Saturday, 8:00pm to 10:00pm, except in cases where the length of the movie necessitates a longer event. The movie nights occur in the Debusk TV lounge, and involve residents watching a movie which has been selected by a committee of residents (The Bean Movie Committee). Soon, when we have established a strong presence on our facebook page, we will add in a voting element to decide which movie is watched. The movie nights also include free snacks for residents.

While the Bean Movie night is primarily advertised in the Bean West and the Bean East complexes, all UO students and their guests are welcome to join. Our goal for each night will be around thirty people. We create weekly movie flyers to advertise around the Bean complexes, and I will be in contact with the RLCs about distributing this information to other complexes. We also have a facebook page. The movie committee currently has five members: 2 RAs, and 3 residents. Both Bean West and Bean East are well represented. We have already put on one program, and by the time the RHA looks this over, we will have put on two. Once the event is established as a weekly routine, we are hoping to find more members, and possibly get representation from other complexes.

The idea for the movie night came from a need for alternative programs during the weekend. It is distinguished from ducks after dark in that it occurs on Saturday, when many residents choose to make poor decisions regarding alcohol. The Bean Movie Committee and their proponents feel that a housing run alternative to more dangerous activities is an important step towards establishing the social acceptability of safe choices.

The Bean Movie Night will have the following advantages:

1. It will provide residents with an alternative to dangerous activities during the weekend.

2. It will give residents interested in movies a valuable leadership opportunity.
3. It will help promote cross-hall, and cross-complex socialization, especially in Bean West and Bean East.
4. It will provide interested hall senators and other residents with a kind of "training program" before they start their own projects. Both committee RAs are willing to explain the finer points of purchase orders, funding requests, PRO-use, and general event planning to people seeking a permanent or temporary place on the Bean Movie Committee.
5. When classical, foreign, or artistic films are shown, it will provide an educational and acculturating opportunity for residents.

The fruit and the drinks will be purchased from market of choice. The Pizza will be purchased from pizza pipeline or a similarly cost efficient pizza place, and we will, on average, have three. The utensils budget might seem low, but should be analyzed with the fact that we already have plates and cups available, and we can probably use them for a few weeks.
