**Project Description:** Project Tomato is an orientation trip for students in the Community for Ecological Leaders (previously the Sustainability Hall). Since 2009, up to 15 students have arrived to campus early and embarked upon a four-day trip exploring local agriculture. Students visit several farms by bicycle and camp at River Bend Farm, in Pleasant Hill. Along the way, students harvest 1,000 pounds of tomatoes and work with Dining Services staff to turn the tomatoes into pizza sauce, which is served in Carson in the week surrounding the Local Foods Meal, one of the most popular themed menus Dining Services does throughout the year. 2012 marked the first year that the tomatoes were grown on campus, in conjunction with the Urban Farm expansion. Growing the tomatoes on campus allowed students the opportunity to see the whole process (growing, harvesting, processing, eating!) and come to a greater understanding of food, farming, and how they relate to campus life.
